# TEACHERS ACADEMY FOR PERSONAL FINANCE



As you may know, Senate Bill 311 requires the integration of financial literacy into the high school curriculum for students entering high schools beginning in 2010. Each school district will determine at what grade level they will teach the content, in which course and by whom.

Named in the legislation as the resource for curriculum development and program delivery, the Ohio Centers for Economic Education have created a program called the "Teachers Academy for Personal Finance". The program will provide you with classroom-ready, interactive resources to deliver the required instruction and help support an implementation plan. The Academy covers six content modules:

1. Financial Decision-making
2. Working and Earning
3. Budgeting, Banking, saving and Philanthropy
4. Effective Use of Credit
5. Wealth Creation and Investing
6. Risk Management

We are currently offering an on-line version of the Teacher Academy for two semester hours of graduate credit. It begins on October 20th and ends December 19th. The course is designed to have schedule flexibility within the time frames indicated – making it a good choice for fitting professional development activities into busy home and work lives!
