The Three E's: Energy, Economics and the Environment

Geared to Grades 4-12

Challenge your students with activities that enable them to analyze energy and environment issues from an economics perspective. With current information on hot-button issues, you'll give your students the knowledge and tools they need to analyze important energy and environment topics. Content will include the relationships between our natural environment and the economy and how they jointly provide us with the goods and services we need and want; fundamental trade-offs; how and why choices are made and how people can make better choices regarding the use of natural resources. The course will have an on-site visit to the Cleveland Botanical Garden with hands-on interactive simulations, discussions, data analysis and Glasshouse explorations.
