General Chicago Manual of Style citation tips

While specific rules apply for each type of reference, general guidelines are applicable when preparing citations. Be sure to consult a Chicago Manual of Style manual for assistance. General reference tips follow:

1. Content notes and bibliographic citations should provide the same information.
2. When creating the bibliography, entries are arranged alphabetically by author's last name.
3. Book citations generally contain author, title, and complete publication information.
4. Author information contains the author's full name, presented last name first, and separated from the title by a period.
5. Title information includes the full title and subtitle, displayed in italic type with correct capitalization.
6. Publication details are presented within brackets and include city, publisher, and date (copyright).
7. Periodical citations generally contain author, title of article, periodical title, issue information, and page.
8. Periodical article title information is enclosed in quotation marks and followed by the periodical title.
9. At this time, Chicago Style does not have specific Internet citation rules. MLA style guides are recommended.
