

# GENERAL ACADEMIC PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN ASHLAND UNIVERSITY AND NORTH CENTRAL STATE COLLEGE

It is agreed that Ashland University and North Central State College desire to continue a strong academic articulation agreement to enhance the transfer opportunities for students from North Central State College to Ashland University for the completion of a Bachelor's Degree. Moreover, it is agreed that a general academic program articulation agreement is to be followed by the development of specific program advising sheets as appropriate.

#### Effective Fall 2020 through Fall 2023

## PROVISIONS OF THE GENERAL ACADEMIC PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT:

- A student, who completes an Associate Degree at North Central State College with a minimum of a 2.25/4.0 GPA, will be accepted at Ashland University with junior status, provided he/she has successfully completed a minimum of sixty (60) semester hours (90 quarter hours) of coursework.
- 2. Only earned credits with grades of C- or better are transferable and recorded on an Ashland University transcript. Letter grades and cumulative grade point average do not transfer.
- 3. North Central State College degree holders may transfer unlimited hours to Ashland University, however, students must meet the following residency requirements:
  - a. At least 30-semester hours of credit must be completed through Ashland University.
  - b. The last 12 semester hours of credit must be completed through Ashland University.
  - c. At least one-half of the student's major requirements must be completed through Ashland University.
- 4. Admission to Ashland University with junior standing will, in many related programs of study, mean the student will be able to complete his/her baccalaureate degree with two years of full-time study. Some students may be able to graduate in less than two years if they are willing to continue their studies during Ashland University's summer terms. In certain disciplines, however, because of their sequential nature, careful prior planning of course work is necessary and more than two years at Ashland University may be needed to complete the Bachelor's Degree.
- 5. In general, remedial and/or developmental orientation courses are not generally transferable to Ashland University and do not meet graduation requirements. Usually, courses numbered 100 and above are transferable as either course-specific or general-elective credit. Technical courses, which do not match up with any Ashland University catalog course, will transfer as general-elective credit. In addition to the regular offerings of North Central State College, courses eligible for transfer include those offered through their off-campus location, and through their video-based program.
- Students transferring to Ashland University must complete all of Ashland University's Institutional Baccalaureate
  Degree Requirements through transfer credit and Ashland University credit where applicable.
- 7. North Central State College degree holders with credits earned at one or more other institutions may transfer those credits to Ashland University subject to Ashland University's transfer policy.

- 8. A student who has earned credits at North Central State College but who has not earned a degree may also apply to Ashland University as a transfer student, subject to transfer regulations in effect at Ashland University. Generally, these requirements include proof of high school graduation (official High School transcripts or G.E.D.) and official college transcripts. Grades of C- or better are accepted with no earned degree.
- Ashland University offers pre-transfer academic advising in order to ensure that the North Central State College student is able to transfer his/her credits in the best manner possible. This is unofficial; an official evaluation takes place upon enrollment at Ashland University.
- 10. Students wishing to transfer to Ashland University, with or without an Associate Degree from North Central State College, may be eligible for federal, state and institutional financial aid. Qualified students may be eligible to receive the Ashland University Transfer Scholarship with the appropriate grade point average and appropriate semester hours of credit. This will be based on all grades earned from all schools attended. The Transfer Scholarship is only available to full-time students attending classes on the main campus.
- 11. Students transferring with less than 30 semester hours of transferable credit will transfer as freshmen. Students transferring with 30-59 semester hours of transferable credit will transfer as sophomores. Students transferring with 60-89 semester hours of transferable credit will transfer as juniors. Students transferring with 90 semester hours or more of transferable credit will transfer as seniors.
- 12. North Central State College and Ashland University agree to participate in regular review of program requirements and appropriate advising procedures, and make adjustments or amendments as deemed appropriate to maintain the integrity of each institution as well as for the improvement of the transfer process. Such changes will not adversely affect students already enrolled and covered under the provisions of the existing agreement.

This articulation agreement will be effective immediately after the representatives of both institutions sign the agreement. It may be modified upon mutual agreement; it may be terminated by either institution upon written notice to the other.

# GENERAL ACADEMIC PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN ASHLAND UNIVERSITY AND NORTH CENTRAL STATE COLLEGE

It is agreed that Ashland University and North Central State College desire to continue a strong academic articulation agreement to enhance the transfer opportunities for students from North Central State College to Ashland University for the completion of a Bachelor's Degree. Moreover, it is agreed that a general academic program articulation agreement is to be followed by the development of specific program advising sheets as appropriate.

#### Effective Fall 2020 through Fall 2023

## PROVISIONS OF THE GENERAL ACADEMIC PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT:

- A student, who completes an Associate Degree at North Central State College with a minimum of a 2.25/4.0 GPA, will be accepted at Ashland University with junior status, provided he/she has successfully completed a minimum of sixty (60) semester hours (90 quarter hours) of coursework.
- 2. Only earned credits with grades of C- or better are transferable and recorded on an Ashland University transcript. Letter grades and cumulative grade point average do not transfer.
- North Central State College degree holders may transfer unlimited hours to Ashland University, however, students must meet the following residency requirements:
  - a. At least 30-semester hours of credit must be completed through Ashland University.
  - b. The last 12 semester hours of credit must be completed through Ashland University.
  - c. At least one-half of the student's major requirements must be completed through Ashland University.
- 4. Admission to Ashland University with junior standing will, in many related programs of study, mean the student will be able to complete his/her baccalaureate degree with two years of full-time study. Some students may be able to graduate in less than two years if they are willing to continue their studies during Ashland University's summer terms. In certain disciplines, however, because of their sequential nature, careful prior planning of course work is necessary and more than two years at Ashland University may be needed to complete the Bachelor's Degree.
- 5. In general, remedial and/or developmental orientation courses are not generally transferable to Ashland University and do not meet graduation requirements. Usually, courses numbered 100 and above are transferable as either course-specific or general-elective credit. Technical courses, which do not match up with any Ashland University catalog course, will transfer as general-elective credit. In addition to the regular offerings of North Central State College, courses eligible for transfer include those offered through their off-campus location, and through their video-based program.
- 6. Students transferring to Ashland University must complete all of Ashland University's Institutional Baccalaureate Degree Requirements through transfer credit and Ashland University credit where applicable.
- North Central State College degree holders with credits earned at one or more other institutions may transfer those
  credits to Ashland University subject to Ashland University's transfer policy.

- 8. A student who has earned credits at North Central State College but who has not earned a degree may also apply to Ashland University as a transfer student, subject to transfer regulations in effect at Ashland University. Generally, these requirements include proof of high school graduation (official High School transcripts or G.E.D.) and official college transcripts. Grades of C- or better are accepted with no earned degree.
- Ashland University offers pre-transfer academic advising in order to ensure that the North Central State College student is able to transfer his/her credits in the best manner possible. This is unofficial; an official evaluation takes place upon enrollment at Ashland University.
- 10. Students wishing to transfer to Ashland University, with or without an Associate Degree from North Central State College, may be eligible for federal, state and institutional financial aid. Qualified students may be eligible to receive the Ashland University Transfer Scholarship with the appropriate grade point average and appropriate semester hours of credit. This will be based on all grades earned from all schools attended. The Transfer Scholarship is only available to full-time students attending classes on the main campus.
- 11. Students transferring with less than 30 semester hours of transferable credit will transfer as freshmen. Students transferring with 30-59 semester hours of transferable credit will transfer as sophomores. Students transferring with 60-89 semester hours of transferable credit will transfer as juniors. Students transferring with 90 semester hours or more of transferable credit will transfer as seniors.
- 12. North Central State College and Ashland University agree to participate in regular review of program requirements and appropriate advising procedures, and make adjustments or amendments as deemed appropriate to maintain the integrity of each institution as well as for the improvement of the transfer process. Such changes will not adversely affect students already enrolled and covered under the provisions of the existing agreement.

This articulation agreement will be effective immediately after the representatives of both institutions sign the agreement. It may be modified upon mutual agreement; it may be terminated by either institution upon written notice to the other.
