

ABOUT AU IN GERMANY

This unique study abroad program takes students on a **16-day** journey to Germany, visiting sights that cover a range of German history. The program has been offered annually since 2005, with over 160 students taking advantage of this great opportunity. Students travel Germany with fellow AU students, earning **six spring semester credits** (2 courses taken in your spring course load and completed in Germany). This program **fulfills the CCI Requirement.**

DEADLINES & PAYMENTS

November 1 - Submit deposit for an Early Bird Grant

December 1 - \$500 non-refundable deposit due in Bixler 211

February 1 - Remaining balance charged to AU account (non-refundable)

- Interest-free until departure date

HOW TO APPLY

- 1. **Submit \$500 non-refundable deposit**, check made out to Ashland University or a debit/credit card, to the Study Abroad Office (Bixler 211) prior to the deadline. You can call 419-289-5870 with debit/credit card information.
- 2. Register for the spring semester courses listed above.

ESTIMATED PROGRAM COST (tentative until flights confirmed) **\$4,385** for 13 students **\$4,145** for 18+ students

INCLUDED: Airfare, double room, excursion package, in-country transportation, daily breakfast, three dinners, rental bike in Wittenberg, tips for tour directors, divers and guides, international health insurance, and kitchen + laundry access in Wittenberg.

NOT INCLUDED: Daily lunches and dinners (approx. \$30+ a day, recommend \$400 minimum), expense for passport (\$165), ETIAS travel visa (\$7-\$9), and personal expenses.

TENTATIVE ITINERARY

May 7	Fly from Ohio to Berlin.
May 8	Arrive in Germany. Walking tour of Wittenberg. Welcome dinner.
May 9-11	Academic days in Wittenberg, Germany.
May 12	Free Day – Optional trip to Leipzig with Dr. Metzger.
May 13-16	Four days in Berlin. Sites include: Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp, city tour, Topography of Terror, Memorial to the German Resistance, Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe, Potsdam: The House of the Wannsee Conference and Sans Souci. Thursday, May 16, is a free day in Berlin.
May 17-20	Academic days in Wittenberg, Germany.
May 21	Drive to Dresden, visit Military Historical museum, continue to Castle Colditz. Overnight at the Castle, which is a youth hostel. Students are in rooms with several beds, could be up to 6. Gender segregated, with private bathroom per room. Dinner included.
May 22	Tour of Castle Colditz with emphasis on prison for officers in WWII. Continue to Leipzig, free time on own. In the evening, return to Wittenberg. Farewell dinner.
May 23	Fly back to Ohio.
