FIRST YEAR HALLS



Amstutz Hall

Amstutz Hall will transition to a first-year and second-year residence hall. Amstutz Hall features single, double and triple rooms. Students who are living in Amstutz Hall for the 2023-2024 academic year and would like to continue their stay can opt to sign up to stay in the same room for the 2024-2025 academic year by letting the Office of Residence Life know via email.

Kem Hall

Kem Hall is a residence hall for only first-year students. Kem Hall features single, double and triple rooms. Each room has a movable desk, dresser and closet. Kem Hall was renovated in summer 2022!



SPECIALTY HOUSING



Clayton Hall

Clayton Hall features regular double rooms with a private bathroom in each room. The hall has laundry rooms on every other floor, updated lounge spaces and air conditioning throughout the building. The second and third floors of Clayton will continue to be reserved for students in the Honors program. Andrews Hall

Andrews Hall will not be available for housing selection outside of the Ashbrook program. With the steady growth of the Ashbrook program, this building will be reserved for Ashbrook students. Andrews Hall features single, double and triple rooms with laundry rooms and full kitchens on each floor. The hall also offers air conditioning and television lounges on all floors. HOUSING APPLICATION

- **Step 1:** Log into housing.ashland.edu using your AU credentials.
- **Step 2:** Look for the "My Housing Profile" tab on the left side of the screen.
- Step 3: Complete the profile.
- Step 4: Go to housing overview.
- Step 5: Fill out the appropriate application.

- **Step 4:** Have all members of the group accept the new group that you created.

WHAT NOT TO BRING

MEAL PLANS

GOLD PLAN - \$3,135

Unlimited meals in the student dining hall plus \$275 Dining Dollars which can be used to purchase guest meals in the dining hall or used as cash at any of the retail locations on campus. The benefit of this plan allows you to take family and friends to the dining hall, while gaining savings over the door price.

PURPLE PLAN - \$2,845

Unlimited meals in the student dining hall located in the John C. Meyers Convocation Center. Students may come and go as many times as they like. You'll never run out of meals! The dining hall offers late-night dining, which makes this plan an excellent value.

TALON PLAN - \$2,845

Receive 160 meals to be used in the dining hall plus an additional \$500 Dining Dollars to be used at any of our dining retail locations such as Eagles' Nest, Tuffy's Smoothie Bar, Lyceum Cafe and concessions.

EAGLE PLAN - \$2,845

This plan gives the student 240 meals to be spread throughout the semester. Meal swipes can be used at the student dining hall or used as equivalency at any of our retail dining locations.

TUFFY PLAN - \$1,145

(For commuter students and campus apartments) Students receive 80 meals to be used in the dining hall or for equivalency at any of our dining retail locations.

NOTE: If you run out of meals, additional 20-meal blocks can be purchased for \$240 or 10-meal blocks for \$125. Dining dollars expire at the end of each semester.

COMMUTER POLICY

HOW TO APPLY

To apply for commuter status, you must complete a commuter application at housing.ashland.edu. Please use the Fall 2024 Off-Campus application.

APPLICATION DETAILS

Applications open on Feb. 1 and are due no later than May 1. After that date, students who have not submitted an application can have room and board charges applied to their student account.

All students must complete either the On Campus or Off-Campus application, and be approved for one.

FINANCIAL AID

Financial Aid may be adjusted for students residing off campus. To make the best decision possible, students are strongly encouraged to meet with a member of the Financial Aid Office to determine the change in aid, if any, that will occur by living off campus. Please call 419-289-5002 for an appointment.

CRITERIA

Must meet one of the following requirements to be approved to live offcampus:

- A student, while in attendance at Ashland University, is living in the permanent primary physical residence of his/her parents or guardian within 35 driving miles of Ashland University's main campus (401 College Ave., Ashland, Ohio 44805) or the Dwight Schar College of Nursing (1020 S. Trimble Road, Mansfield, Ohio 44906), Mansfield Campus for the upper-class College of Nursing students.
- A student is married, divorced or widowed.
- A student is 22 years old or older prior to Oct. 1 of that academic year.
- A student has served in the Armed Forces and received an honorable discharge.
- A student has lived in campus housing the equivalent of eight fall and spring semesters enrolled in academic coursework each semester.
- A student is the holder of a Bachelor degree from an accredited four-year college/university.
- A new transfer student who has a minimum of 45 credits from an accredited college/university.

CAMPUS INVOLEMENT

Living on campus creates plenty of opportunities to get involved on campus. The close proximity of the residence halls to various campus centers makes it easy to attend evening activities and club meetings.

INSTANT COMMUNITY

Become a member of a community through in-hall programming such as record-painting nights, stress-less activities and murder mystery games. Engage your community by studying in the halls' study areas, playing games in the community lounges and getting to know your fellow residents. Living on campus is also a great way to improve one's interpersonal skills!

INCREASED RESOURCES

Residents can have peace of mind knowing that Safety Services and Residence Life staff provide 24/7 safety and support. Additionally, maintenance and utilities for residents are included in housing costs. Students also enjoy close and convenient access to the Rec Center, the Student Center, on-campus dining options, etc.
