

CCP Pathways


CCP pathways are flexible planning tools designed to help you choose college courses that fit your goals, schedule, and interests while you're still in high school. Ohio requires colleges to offer suggested 15- and 30-credit hour pathways, but you are not required to complete one. You may take as few or as many courses as you like, as long as you stay within the 30 credits per year and 120 total credits allowed. **The pathways shown are just examples of popular options at AU, and your CCP advisor can help you build a personalized plan.** A 15-hour pathway is ideal for lighter college coursework, while a 30-hour pathway is for students hoping to complete a full year of college credit. Associate degree pathways are also available for students not planning to pursue a bachelor's degree.

IMPORTANT: Please take your participation in College Credit Plus seriously.

- While admission to the nursing program (after high school) is primarily based on your HS GPA and ACT score, grades in BIO 222, BIO 223 and CHEM 253 from the CCP nursing academy pathway will also be reviewed. A grade of C or lower in any of these is considered a nursing course failure and receiving two or more C or lower grades in required science courses (BIO 222, 223, 240, CHEM 253) will result in dismissal from the CCP Nursing Academy (but not the CCP program) and ineligibility for admission to Ashland University's nursing program.
- Additionally, a minimum grade of C+ is required in all nursing major courses, including MATH 108, PSYC 101, PHIL 215, BIO 222, BIO 223, and CHEM 253.
- Consult your HS counselor for HS graduation requirements.
- Participation in the CCP Nursing Academy does not guarantee admission to the College of Nursing and Health Sciences. Students must submit a formal application and meet the established admissions criteria for the Nursing program. Acceptance is contingent upon both qualifications and program capacity at the time of application.

**The Critical Cultural Inquiry (CCI) requirement can be fulfilled by one of the following: a value-added foreign language course, an approved study-away or study abroad experience or one CCI course. One slot should be allotted for CORE/CCI, but students completing the requirement with study abroad can substitute an elective if necessary to reach 125 hours. If students are continuing a language study, it is preferable to take the course during the first semester of the first year.*

The **Bachelor of Science in Nursing** degree is comprised of the following types of courses:

- **Institutional core courses** (these are taken by ALL AU students, AKA “Core” or “Gen Ed” courses)
- **Prerequisite, non-nursing courses** required by the nursing major which provide a foundation for nursing coursework (such as BIO 222/223, MATH 108 and CHEM 253 in the CCP Pathway).
- **Courses in the nursing major** (such as those courses with the NUR prefix in the 3-Year Curriculum Track above). Students must apply and be admitted to the nursing program before taking any NUR coursework, other than NUR 110/210.
- ****Total hours:** (CCP Nursing Academy, 35 hours) + (3-Year Traditional Track above, 90 hours) = 125 credit hours
