ABOUT HONORS 390: Greece

During Spring 2027, Honors students will take HON 390 studying cross-disciplinary topics about the history, culture, and economics of the locations to be visited. Specific topics have not been determined as it depends on the availability of faculty to teach the topics. Following Commencement, Honors students will travel for 11 days in Greece in a group comprised solely of Honors students. Students will complete journals and CCI narratives based on their experiences on the trip. **Honors students will earn credit for HON 390, the Honors Elective (study abroad path), and the CCI when they complete the Narrative.**

ESTIMATED PROGRAM COST

 (Tentative until flights are booked)

\$4,771 (based on 20 students traveling)

\$4,520 (based on 30 students traveling)

First 20 students to make their deposit receive a \$500 Honors grant!

INCLUDED: Roundtrip airfare, in-country transportation, hotel accommodations (doubles), admission fees, international health insurance, daily breakfast, 1 lunch, 3 dinners, tips for 24/7 tour manager, drivers and local guides.

NOT INCLUDED: Meals not specified (approx. \$300), expenses for passport (\$165), mandatory international phone plan, ETIAS travel visa (\$10-\$15), personal expenses, trip cancellation and interruption insurance.

February 1 - Remaining balance charged to your AU account.

TENTATIVE ITINERARY

DAY	LOCATION	PROGRAM
1	Travel, 5/10	Depart the USA.
2	Athens, 5/11	Arrive in Athens. Walk through Plaka. Visit the Temple of Olympian Zeus. Gather for a welcome dinner.
3	Athens, 5/12	See the Panathenaic Stadium. Pass through Syntagma Square, then visit the Acropolis with a guided exploration of the Parthenon, Propylaea, and more. Free evening to explore.
4	Saronic Islands, Athens, 5/13	Explore three islands of the Saronic gulf; Aegina, Poros, and Hydra. Return to Athens in the evening.
5	Athens, Corinth, Epidaurus, Nafplion, 5/14	Head over to Corinth and visit the Corinth Canal. Continue to Epidaurus and its well-preserved ancient theater. Spend the rest of the day in Nafplion. Spend the night in Nafplion
6	Epidaurus, Nafplion, 5/15	Visit the Theatre of Epidaurus. Enjoy local olive oil tasting. Return to Nafplion and hike over to Palamadi Castle or explore the city.
7	Nafplion, Mycenae, Olympia, 5/16	Start the day in Nafplion before traveling over to Mycenae. Explore the Lion Gate, royal tombs, and remnants of a once-powerful citadel. End the day in Olympia with a traditional Greek dinner and a folk show with Greek dances.
8	Olympia, Delphi, 5/17	Discover Olympia's ancient athletic grounds, temples, and more. Tour the Olympia Museum. Continue on to Delphi's mountain scenery. Stay the night in Delphi.
9	Delphi, Athens, 5/18	Begin the day exploring Delphi. Visit the Delphi Archaeological Museum. Walk along the Sacred Way to the Temple of Apollo. Return to Athens for the night.
10	Athens, 5/19	Ride or walk up Lycabettus Hill, the city's highest point. Remainder of day for free time to explore Athens. Optional: attend a Greek cooking class or show. Gather for a farewell dinner.
11	Travel, 5/20	Depart for USA.
